

Spring time is a lovely season when new life bursts on the scene... Here in Aldershot we too are entering a new season.



As always, we thank God for His faithfulness for all He has blessed us with in the work those special times to care and share and all the little seeds that have been planted.





Unexpected visitors!

The Bible is filled with examples of people hosting unexpected visitors. In Genesis 18 we read how Abraham had 3 men suddenly appear to visit him. In Matthew 2 we read how even Jesus had some unexpected guests arrive – the Wise men from the East. Jesus told parables too about unexpected guests asking friends for food at midnight hours. This last quarter, here in Pirbright, we had the wonderful opportunity to host a few unexpected visitors!



Our first very unusual visitor was a big Chinook helicopter landing right outside the centre. As it came into land, the very strong wind currents lifted and destroyed our little playhouse for the children. It was all very exciting but a bit daunting. The recruits were clearly excited about being flown away for their battle camp!





Our next unexpected visitor was Coronation Street's Sean Tully. He is an ambassador for armed forces' charities, Help 4 Heroes and SSAFA and had popped in to visit with a soldier. He graciously posed with some very 'awe struck' ladies.

Our next unexpected visitor was truly a wonderful surprise. Warrant Officer Victoria Blackburn was one of a mixed team of four called Force Atlantic who rowed across the Atlantic, finishing the journey in 41 days exactly, beating the previous record by a whopping 33 hours. Be sure to google this remarkable achievement!



These visitors were soon followed by a wonderfully unexpected request for a leaving lunch for the Brigadier's personal assistant. We felt very honoured to host the Brigadier and these lovely people from his office.

We all love our veterans and what joy filled the centre as Tony Vickers from the Coldstream Guards of 1972 popped in for a visit. He remembered the Centre fondly and was eager to share his military journey with us. He loved all the new changes and hopefully will return again to visit us.



And then finally, just as this article was being penned, Johnson Beharry visited us. A soldier who, on 18 March 2005, was awarded the Victoria Cross, the highest military award for valour in the British and Commonwealth armed forces, for saving members of his unit, the 1st Battalion, Princess of Wales' Royal Regiment, from ambushes on 1 May and again on 11 June 2004 at Al-Almarah. He sustained serious head injuries in the latter engagement. Beharry was formally invested with the Victoria Cross by Queen Elizabeth II on 27 April 2005. He trained in Pirbright 21 years ago and it was such a privilege to host him again after all these years.



Thinking about all these wonderful unexpected visitors, makes one reflect on what we do personally when unexpected visitors arrive at the door of our homes. Maybe the kids are being naughty, maybe you are in an argument with your spouse, maybe the house is in a mess, maybe there is not enough food! Of course, unexpected guests aren't a problem if our house is in order but clearly that is easier said than done. As we look at the world right now, there are many unexpected events taking place around us and we realise that many things in life happen whether we are ready or not. Imagine our military not being ready? That's their whole purpose - to be ready in case we are attacked. They practice,

they train, they might even get calls in the middle of the night! The Bible tells us, there is another unexpected event taking place - the return of Jesus! Christians believe that Jesus Christ is going to come back and when it happens, absolutely everyone will know about it. His return is often called the Second Coming. It will be an extraordinary, unprecedented moment in history - very different to his first arrival as a helpless baby in Bethlehem. The Bible gives clues about what it might be like but does not say when it will happen. The question will be - will I be ready, is my house in order?

Moses' arms soon became so tired he could no longer hold them up. So Aaron and Hur found a stone for him to sit on. Then they stood on each side of Moses, holding up his hands. So his hands held steady until sunset. **Exodus 17:12**

It has not been the easiest start to the year. There have been lots of testing situations (some of which I will share later) but during a time when we were short staffed I read the following devotional in a book called "Faith on the front line"

"..... Whilst everyday issues can leave us feeling slightly battered and bruised, we can usually carry on OK. Sometimes though, our habit, or standards, slip or fall too far either through neglect or complete exhaustion, and we cannot regain ourselves. At these times rather than fall into the Abyss we need to rely on God and our God given friends to share our burdens and lift us

back on track and enable us to carry on our journey. In Exodus 17 Moses was unable to keep his hands raised when he grew tired and relied on Aaron and Hur to raise his hands, allowing the Israelites to prevail in the fight against the Amalekites. In the same way we need to support one another through prayer, by example and practical help. Galatians 6 warns us to watch out for others and for ourselves, so that we are not caught out by sin and to carry each other's burdens

Whilst reading the above passage God showed me in the midst of the testing season we are going through that God has placed faithful friends and work colleagues alongside us to support us and to hold us up when we are tired. People like our volunteers Amanda, Norman, Stephen and Kitty and a special word of mention to our "Aaron and Hur" Leanne and Julie

(Julie is covering here while the Hollywood Centre is closed) who have been amazing in the support and extra duties and effort they have put into supporting and helping us this quarter.

It all started over the Christmas holidays when the heating system broke down in our building and we were only able to open for two days before we had to close again. The resulting work meant that our car park was dug up and we had to close for three weeks. Then as we were due to open Jan took Covid and we had to remain shut for a further week. Also over Christmas two of our staff left us, one due to health reasons and another due to a change in her employment status.



We eventually reopened on the 7th of February two staff down and were getting quite busy. Then on the 17th of February Megan our daughter took ill and after a traumatic three days had to have emergency-life saving surgery. As a result of this Jan has had to take extra time off (she still comes in every day but sometimes has to take Megan to appointments etc.) to care for her as there have been a few complications in her recovery too.

There have been other tests and trials this year from incidents to accidents but rather than dwell on them I want to remain thankful to God for His provision and enabling power throughout. How He has prompted people to pray for us and to help out in many different ways. He truly is reliable in all of life's storms and we could not do the job we do without Him.



Since reopening we have seen the centre become quite busy again and it has been amazing to be able to actually “be here” for the soldiers again. Although our staff shortages have meant that we have not had as much time as we would like to spend with the guys and girls as they come in we are still able to catch moments with some of them and to pray with them. Leanne had the privilege to be invited to a dinner by one of our wives’ prayer time ladies in their home. It was a good chance to get to know each of the guests in a relaxed setting.

On of the few quiet days we had a contractor came in and I (Trevor) was able to chat with him. He used to be a regular in Ballykinlar and this was his first time in the Lisburn Centre. He was able to share with me some very difficult situations within his family and it was great just to be able to sit and be a listening ear for him.

We are hoping to start some new staff in the next couple of weeks to ease our burdens and Jan should be back to normal hours soon. As Megan continues to recover, we are not sure what lies ahead for the rest of the year and it has virtually been

impossible to plan ahead for anything but we are determined to keep seeking God and to keep praising Him in all circumstances even if we struggle to understand why some circumstances come our way.
